WHAT'S NEW IN THE POEME PROJECT?

The POEME partnership has been working hard to achieve the goals set for the project. Take a look at the highlights from the last 6 months!

The POEME E-worksheets are officially finalized and translated into the languages of the partnership. There are 18 worksheets in each language - that is - English, French, Greek and Portuguese. They are focused on elements of tangible, intangible, natural and digital cultural heritage of the partner countries and are available in different levels according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (A1 to B2). With the help of these worksheets, teachers will be able to develop their students' language skills by teaching them about elements of European cultural heritage.

The partnership has also started working on the development of educational e-books based on elements of cultural heritage of the partner countries. The e-books are aimed at language learning and cover the topics in a fun and engaging way, with interactive elements, including voice-overs of the contents. The e-books will be available soon on the POEME website, in English and translated to the partner's languages.
